Greetings from the Farm Advisor!

This newsletter is full of events and educational opportunities coming up in the next three months, and there is a handy "save-the-date" list at the end of the newsletter for reference that you don't want to miss. There are workshops for land managers, livestock producers, hay producers, and more. Join us for an afternoon to learn about current research and socialize with your neighbors. As always, feel free to reach out if you have any questions or are particularly interested in anything we are working on.

I have been working on a couple interesting projects this winter. The first is helping to address revisions for the Big Valley Groundwater Sustainability Plan and preparing the water year 2023 annual report. With the help of David Lile, we have been working with West Yost (engineering company) and County staff to address the Department of Water Resources incomplete status of the report. Data we collected between 2018-2023 have helped to support that the basin has had very little groundwater depletion over the last ten years. If you are interested in this process, there will be public Big Valley Groundwater Advisory Committee meetings in March and April, more information TBD.

I have also partnered with the Modoc National Forest and Modoc Farm Bureau to start the NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act) process to authorize grazing on four vacant USFS allotments on the west side of Modoc County. These allotments could open up over 90,000 acres of public grazing land. The scoping letter process occurred between November and January and we are working to address comments and plan for field season data collection of range condition. On a regional level, we are working with the USFS to help other partners address the nearly 40% of allotments vacant in California.

I got to spend some time with Livestock Advisors David Lile and Josh Davy at the Red Bluff Bull and Gelding Sale (picture below). California Cattlemen, Cattle Council, California Farm Bureau and UC-CE have a combined booth in the trade show through 1/27/24. All of us in the office are all looking forward to seeing you at the upcoming meetings and events. Come meet our new employees, Laurie Wayne and Simar Singh.

He will be working on issues related to irrigated pasture systems such as improving water use efficiency, resource conservation, new crops, and increasing sustainability and profitability of farm operations. Simar will be working with growers, CCAs, industry groups, regulatory agencies, and other agriculture community members to provide them with resources and help with
