Greetings from the Farm Advisor,

We are excited that our footprint is growing in Modoc County! This past year we were successful in the search for two new advisors for our Alturas Office. We welcomed Laurie Wayne as our new Nutrition and Food Systems Advisor covering Modoc, Lassen and Siskiyou Counties July 6th. We will also be welcoming Simar Singh as our new Grass Systems Advisor covering Modoc, Lassen and Shasta Counties starting November 6th. It has been over 50 years since three advisors were located in Modoc County. As we grow, we will be moving things around in the office the next couple months so excuse our mess and come visit us soon to meet our new staff.

This summer has been a busy one as research has continued on livestock mortality composting, public land range monitoring, and new grazing technologies. Mavrick Farnam was a huge help this summer organizing several projects including the range monitoring trip to the South Warner Wilderness. We continue to work to find opportunities to reauthorize vacant allotments, utilize modern grazing management practices and improve rangelands in Modoc County. Impacting government policy continues to be a major task from working on the Pit River Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program exemption to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act in Big Valley and grasshopper crop damage relief. We had a great time at the Modoc District Fair, organizing and running the Ag Building for members of the community including conducting canning demonstrations with the Intermountain Master Food Preservers.

This newsletter is full of events and educational opportunities coming up in the next three months and there is a handy save the date list at the end of the newsletter for reference that you don't want to miss. 

UCCE RESEARCH UPDATE



Grazing Technology Makes a Preview in Modoc County

New grazing technologies including virtual fencing, GPS eartags, livestock health monitors, pedometers and more are being developed across the world to make livestock production more efficient, safer, and easier. UCCE Modoc is working with livestock advisors from around NE California to test out some of these new technologies. The pictures are a cellular service based GPS eartag program where livestock location can be monitored from a cell phone. The eartag - roughly the size of a regular eartag has a solar panel for charging and pings to an antennae that then pings to an app on a cell phone. The location updates four times per day, every six hours.

We are also testing virtual fencing in Lassen County and a satellite based eartag in Plumas County.



There are many potential applications for these grazing technologies but there are still quite a few kinks to work out with the equipment and the computer programing. Look for more information about these technologies

at the winter ag meeting.

UC Intermountain Master Food Preservers: Sign up now for Winter Training

The University of California Master Food Preserver Program extends UC research-based information about home food safety and preservation to the public. Master Food Preserver graduates not only learn a range of methods for keeping food safely over time, they also offer volunteer services and outreach to communities throughout the Intermountain region. The next training starts in January 2024 and consists of 11 online sessions Thursday 6:30-8:30pm or Friday 2-4pm as well as 4 hands-on classes in Alturas. The UC Master Food Preserver training program consists of over 40 hours of intensive training and costs \$50 for Modoc County Residents. This price covers three training manuals, class materials, and all lab expenses. Apply
